Your community needs you! Emergency radio training course on Thursday 31 August

This week there were two serious slips in Cluny Road and the Porirua Emergency Response Team was mobilised to carry out reconnaissance and report back on the situation.

Because not enough people here took up the previous offer to be trained in the use of emergency radios, Plimmerton could not offer a local response.

Training is FREE and open to everyone in the wider area.

A course will be held on **Thursday 31 August** in the evening, followed by a practical exercise on **Sunday 3 September**, so YOU can learn how to carry out a reccy with these radios in the event of emergencies.
